 1. Bamboo trees – it is invasive so it can take over, and attractive to ticks
 2. Other tree options? Cedar trees, Juniper (larger shrubs with more density)
 3. Urban forestry contact – Elizabeth with HDC will send a contact
 4. 485 after providence towards independence, may be evergreen trees
 5. Need to consider any longer-term risk to large trees potentially falling over onto homes – what is the maintenance required for any type of trees?
 6. New fencing
 7. Rain garden – to slow the flow of water or capture the rain water
 8. Flowers
 9. Berm – manmade hill of dirt

Other items:

- New leadership in Washington heights community – trying to activate the arts space (Beatties Ford and Tate)
- Andrill terrace water run off issue – could we use the neighborhood matching grant
- Lights off of highway 16 exit on Beatties Ford
- Speed bumps – was told we did not qualify but we did not get the strips done for the study
 - That is back in the works – Washington, Patton and Madison
- Street light on Patton (between Condon and Mulberry) – on the list to be worked on, but it can take 18+ months for Duke to evaluate, design and get approval, then 30 days of feedback requests, and then installation can take 6-8 weeks once scheduled
- Neighborhood matching grant was submitted – late April/May we'll hear back, and receive funds in June
 - Community garden – on the Moreland lot, 10 raised beds, they've allowed us to use their water, they will determine the name as a memorial
 - Yard of the quarter – asking for committee members to develop the qualifications
 - Ms. Marilyn volunteered
 - Will send an email out asking for participation
